The Housing Outreach Mentorship Encouragement (H.O.M.E.) Program provides transitional housing and housing subsidy assistance to homeless female Veterans and their eligible children. The H.O.M.E. Program focuses on integrating Veterans back into their local communities and providing vast residential areas to choose from.

Our H.O.M.E. Program is a collaboration with our resource partners that includes transitional housing, job placement, job training, financial planning, education, and counseling. The H.O.M.E. Program is currently only open to female Veterans that live in DC, Maryland or Virginia (DC Metro Area).

S.A.F.E.

The Savings Assessment and Financial Education (S.A.F.E.) Program will prevent homelessness by easing financial hardships through rent and utility assistance via interest free loans. The S.A.F.E. Program serves eligible applicants in the DC Metro Area.

FINAL SALUTE, INC.

It is estimated that there are currently over 13,000 homeless female Veterans in the United States. For the sacrifices they and their families have made, this is an unacceptable state for any of them to be in.

Of the 500 transitional housing programs for male veterans in the United States, a little over half can accept women. Some female Veterans who have experienced Military Sexual Trauma (MST) may not be comfortable staying in co-ed facilities. There are affordable housing programs and temporary housing units available to all Veterans, but the waiting lists are long and some female Veterans have minor children for which they are responsible; some facilities cannot accommodate children. Over half of homeless female Veterans are single mothers.

Factors contributing to homelessness:

- Unemployment
- Legal Trouble
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)
- Military Sexual Trauma (over 19,000 reported rapes and sexual assaults in the military last year)
- Ineligibility for or lack of Veteran's benefits
- Disabilities
- Divorce/Separation
- Domestic violence
- Lack of family or social support network
- Substance abuse
