Conrad Chun serves as the director of Communications for Global Services & Support (GS&S) and is responsible for all aspects of the communications efforts, including external, internal, and marketing communications. GS&S is a global operation that sustains aircraft and systems with a full spectrum of products and services, including aircraft maintenance, modification and upgrades; pilot and maintenance training; supply chain management; engineering and logistics support; and other defense and government services. Prior to this, Chun served as the director of Communications for Boeing Military Aircraft, where his responsibilities included leading the development, coordination and implementation of communications strategy and plans for the entire business unit.

Chun joined The Boeing Company in 2010 after retiring from the U.S. Navy as a captain with 24 years of service. Throughout his distinguished military career he has held a series of high profile communications positions, garnering experience in crisis communications, media relations, legislative affairs and strategic planning. Chun was special assistant for public affairs to the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO). In this role, he was the sole communications advisor to the CNO, providing strategic counsel on a vast portfolio of operational, budgetary and international issues and programs.

Chun's other assignments include director of public affairs and community outreach, U.S. Fleet Forces Command, and director of public affairs, U.S. Second Fleet,

where he led the Navy's public affairs efforts during Hurricane Katrina in 2005. Prior to this assignment, Chun served as the assistant chief of Information for Media Operations at the Navy's Public Affairs headquarters in The Pentagon. From 2001-2003, Chun served as the director of congressional and public affairs, Navy Office of Legislative Affairs in The Pentagon, which serves as the Navy's communications arm with Congress. Prior to this role, Chun was assigned as the U.S. Pacific Fleet's media officer, where he served as the lead spokesperson for a number of high-visibility incidents such as the Navy's search and salvage operation for the Alaskan Airlines flight 261 crash off southern California in 2000, and the tragic collision between the USS Greenville and the Japanese trawler Ehime Maru off the Oahu coast in early 2001. Shortly thereafter, Chun served as the lead spokesperson for the Navy EP-3 reconnaissance aircraft mid-air collision involving a Chinese J-8 jet fighter in the airspace over the South China Sea.

Chun is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. He holds a bachelor's degree in economics and a master's in information systems from the Naval Postgraduate School. Chun currently serves on the board of directors for Military Spouse Corporate Career Network (MSCCN), a non-profit organization that focuses on the Employment readiness training programs, job placement solutions, and no-cost services to all military-affiliated spouses, retired military spouses and caregivers to war wounded heroes.
